CONFERENCE OBJECTIVES

At the conclusion of the Conference, the participants should be able to:

- Identify issues related to care of pediatric trauma patients in an adult resuscitation area.
- Explain critical care related topics such as, managing patients with multisystem organ dysfunction, providing respiratory therapy after severe trauma or sepsis, and caring for the organ donor patient.
- Develop a plan of care appropriate for patients with a pelvic ring fracture, liver injury, thoracic trauma, spinal cord injury, maritime trauma or blast injury.
- Define specific interventions that should be considered when caring for trauma patients with an altered mental status, managing the obese trauma patient, treating patients with hyperbaric pressure, or rendering care to a patient with necrotizing fasciitis.
- Analyze challenging aspects of trauma care including administering fluids, providing appropriate nutritional support, preventing hospital acquired infections, treating posttraumatic infections, managing patients taking anticoagulants prior to injury, avoiding deep vein or pulmonary emboli, rehabilitating the injured patient, and providing support for trauma survivors.
- Describe the currently recommended basic life support and advanced life support guidelines, how trauma constitutes a public health issue and use of telemedicine to combat looming staff shortages.
- Demonstrate how to use evidence based practice to determine the best trauma care.
- List strategies to effectively deal with work place conflict.

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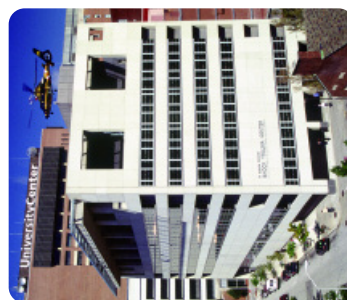
