- Does this specialty/subspecialty require a preliminary training year (e.g., Dermatology, Radiology)
- Anticipated PGY Level of Appointment
- Does PGY Level of Appointment Differ from Traditional Entry PGY Pathway (e.g., starting internal medicine at a PGY-2 versus PGY-1)
