FACTS

The University of Maryland Medical Center (UMMC) in Baltimore provides a full range of health care services, coordinated across two hospital campuses and several community locations. As the flagship of the University of Maryland Medical System, UMMC serves as a referral center for the most critically ill and injured patients in the Mid-Atlantic region. UMMC was established in 1823 in partnership with the first public medical school in the nation. Today, as then, all attending physicians at UMMC are faculty members at the University of Maryland School of Medicine.



MAJOR CENTERS AND SERVICES

The R Adams Cowley Shock Trauma Center is the world leader in trauma care, research and training, and is the heart of Maryland's model emergency medical services system.

The University of Maryland Children's Hospital is a regional resource for diagnosing and treating serious and complex health problems in infants through young adults.

The University of Maryland Marlene and Stewart Greenebaum Comprehensive Cancer Center (UMGCCC) is one of only 47 NCI-designated comprehensive cancer centers and ranked among the top 50 cancer centers in the nation by *U.S. News and World Report*.

The University of Maryland Division of Transplantation is one of the nation's busiest transplant programs — performing more than 400 organ transplants a year. The Scientific Registry of Transplant Recipients has recognized UMMC for above-average outcomes for adults undergoing living-donor transplant.

The University of Maryland Heart and Vascular Center is a national leader in minimally invasive treatment options.

The Joint Commission recognizes UMMC as a **Comprehensive Stroke Center**, a designation awarded to about 100 centers in the US.

UMMC is a leader in **time-sensitive critical care**, with 11 specialized intensive care units. Physicians and hospitals across the region refer their most critically ill patients to UMMC, with coordination by **Maryland ExpressCare**.

UMMC is among the less than 10 percent of US hospitals with **Magnet Designation for nursing excellence**, as recognized by the American Nurses Credentialing Center.

A REGIONAL CENTER FOR SPECIALTY AND CRITICAL CARE

Nearly one-third of all beds at UMMC are dedicated to critical care, also called intensive care, in 11 specialized units dedicated to subspecialties such as neurotrauma, cardiac surgery, cardiac care and neurological critical care. In the last two years, UMMC opened three innovative units: the **Critical Care Resuscitation Unit**, the **Lung Rescue Unit** and the **Thoracic Intermediate Care Unit**, the first of its kind in the region dedicated to thoracic surgery patients.

UMGCCC is a **National Cancer Institute** (NCI)-Designated Comprehensive Cancer Center, a distinction shared by just 47 centers across the country and a testament to the quality of its cancer research.

The **R Adams Cowley Shock Trauma Center** at UMMC serves more than 8,600 critically ill and severely injured people each year. It is the highest-volume trauma center in the United States.

The Level IV **Drs. Rouben and Violet Jiji Neonatal Intensive Care Unit** (NICU) at the University of Maryland Children's Hospital provides the highest level of care to babies born prematurely or with complications. Research from neonatology faculty at the University of Maryland School of Medicine has shown that lighting and sound levels matter for tiny infants, so the new 52-bed NICU was designed to emulate the environment in a mother's womb as closely as possible.

The **Beacon Award for Excellence**—the most prestigious national recognition for critical care—has been awarded to three UMMC units, most recently to the Multi-Trauma Intermediate Care 6 Unit.

DEDICATED TO COMMUNITY HEALTH IMPROVEMENT

Caring for the sick is only part of the University of Maryland Medical Center's mission.

In fiscal year 2016, UMMC's University and Midtown campuses together provided a total of \$251 million in services that benefit our community.

UMMC takes services to where residents live, work and go to school. The **Breathmobile** provides primary care and education to children with asthma, and travels to meet kids at their schools. The **Bridge Program** serves victims of intimate-partner violence long after they leave the hospital. The **Maryland Healthy Men Program** reduces hypertension risk for African-American men with incentives such as gym memberships and healthy-cooking classes. And **University of Maryland Primary Care** locations give residents the continuity and coordination of care to stay healthy and out of the hospital.

As one of Baltimore's largest employers, UMMC provides **workforce development programs for adults and teens**, and hires many of those who successfully complete the programs.
